DIGEST OF HB 1180 (Updated February 28, 2000 3:10 PM - DI 75)

Citations Affected: IC 4-20.5; IC 36-1.

Synopsis: Display of Ten Commandments on public property. Authorizes the display of the Ten Commandments on real property owned by the state or a political subdivision as part of an exhibit displaying other documents of historical significance that formed and influenced the United States legal or governmental system.

Effective: July 1, 2000.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1180

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state and local administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 4-20.5-21 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
