Summary of Legislation: This bill makes it a Class B infraction (subject to a maximum civil judgment of \$1,000) instead of a Class C infraction (subject to a maximum civil judgment of \$500) for a person to violate a speed limit that is imposed in the immediate vicinity of a school when children are present.

Effective Date: July 1, 2000.

Explanation of State Expenditures:

Explanation of State Revenues: Revenue to the state General Fund could increase if an infraction is changed from Class C to Class B. The maximum judgment for a Class C infraction is \$500 while the maximum judgment for a Class B infraction is \$1,000. Proceeds from infraction judgments are deposited in the state General Fund. No additional revenue would be expected since the court fees for both infraction types are \$70 effective July 1, 1997.
