**Summary of Legislation:** (Amended) This bill authorizes the display of the Ten Commandments on real property owned by the state or a political subdivision as part of an exhibit displaying other documents of historical significance that formed and influenced the United States legal or governmental system. The bill provides that the statute may not be construed to prohibit the continued display of the Ten Commandments in an existing freestanding monument.
