Summary of Legislation: This bill requires the superintendent of a school corporation or equivalent authority of an accredited nonpublic school to notify the state superintendent of public instruction when the administrator knows that a current or former employee with a teacher's license has been convicted of an offense for which a teacher loses a license. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the Interim Study Committee on Education Issues.)

Effective Date: July 1, 2000.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The Department of Education does not anticipate any additional costs associated with the receipt of the notifications.
