**Summary of Legislation:** This bill provides that an absentee voter board must make at least one additional visit to the residence or place of confinement of a confined voter if the voter was unavailable at the time of the board's first visit.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2000.

**Explanation of Local Expenditures:** This bill could increase the expenditures of an absentee voter board if an additional visit is required to a confined voter. IC 3-11-10-38 provides that each member of the absentee voter board is entitled to per diem (set by the county executive) and mileage (set by the county fiscal body). The amount of per diem and mileage will vary among counties. The fiscal impact of this bill is indeterminable and dependent on the number of additional visits the absentee voter board must make to confined voters.
