
SENATE BILL No. 243

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-1; IC 25-20.2; IC 34-30-2-98.8.

Synopsis: Licensing of home inspectors. Establishes the Indiana home inspectors licensing board to regulate home inspectors and associate home inspectors in Indiana. Sets the qualifications for licensed home inspectors and associate home inspectors. Provides that a person who performs home inspections for compensation without a license commits a Class B infraction. Requires that a civil action based upon the professional services of a licensed home inspector in Indiana must be filed within two years from the date of the act or omission that is the subject of the complaint.

Effective: July 1, 2000; January 1, 2001.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

 35 subsection (b) shall send a notice of the upcoming expiration of a
 36 license to each licensee at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration
 37 of the license. The notice must inform the licensee of the need to renew
 38 and the requirement of payment of the renewal fee. If this notice of
 39 expiration is not sent by the entity, the licensee is not subject to a
 40 sanction for failure to renew if, once notice is received from the entity,
 41 the license is renewed within forty-five (45) days of the receipt of the
 42 notice.

17 **ARTICLE 20.2. HOME INSPECTORS**

18 **Chapter 1. Short Title and Definitions**

19 **Sec. 1. This article may be cited as the "Indiana Home**
 20 **Inspectors Licensing Act".**

21 **Sec. 2. The definitions in this chapter apply throughout this**
 22 **article.**

23 **Sec. 3. "Agency" refers to the Indiana professional licensing**
 24 **agency established by IC 25-1-6-3.**

25 **Sec. 4. "Board" refers to the Indiana home inspectors licensing**
 26 **board established by IC 25-20.2-2-1.**

27 **Sec. 5. "Client" means a person who hires or seeks to hire a**
 28 **licensed home inspector or a licensed associate home inspector to**
 29 **obtain an inspection of and a written report on the condition of a**
 30 **residential building.**

31 **Sec. 6. "Home inspection" means a noninvasive, physical**
 32 **examination that is performed on real property and:**

33 **(1) examines, through visual means and the normal user**
 34 **controls, without the use of mathematical sciences, the:**

35 **(A) mechanical, electrical, or plumbing systems; or**

36 **(B) structural or other essential components;**

37 **or both, of a residential dwelling; and**

38 **(2) is designed to identify visible defects in and the current**
 39 **condition of the systems, structures, and components**
 40 **described in subdivision (1).**

41 **The term does not include a code compliance inspection.**

42 **Sec. 7. "Home inspection report" means a written report**

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1 prepared and issued after a home inspection.

2 **Sec. 8. "Licensed associate home inspector" means a person**
3 **who:**

- 4 (1) has not fulfilled the requirements for a home inspector
5 license;
6 (2) is licensed as an associate home inspector under this
7 article; and
8 (3) performs home inspections under the supervision of a
9 licensed home inspector.

10 **Sec. 9. "Licensed home inspector" means a person who:**

- 11 (1) performs home inspections; and
12 (2) is licensed as a home inspector under this article.

13 **Sec. 10. "Licensee" means a person who performs home**
14 **inspections and who is licensed under this article as a home**
15 **inspector or an associate home inspector.**

16 **Sec. 11. "Residential dwelling" means a structure consisting of**
17 **at least one (1) but not more than five (5) dwelling units, whether**
18 **occupied or unoccupied.**

19 **Chapter 2. Indiana Home Inspectors Licensing Board**

20 **Sec. 1. The Indiana home inspectors licensing board is created.**

21 **Sec. 2. The board is composed of seven (7) members, all of**
22 **whom must be Indiana residents, appointed by the governor as**
23 **follows:**

- 24 (1) Four (4) members who:
25 (A) are licensed home inspectors; and
26 (B) have been actively engaged in the practice of
27 performing home inspections in Indiana for at least five (5)
28 years before their appointment to the board.
29 (2) One (1) member who:
30 (A) is a home builder; and
31 (B) has been actively engaged in the practice of home
32 building in Indiana for at least five (5) years before the
33 member's appointment to the board.
34 (3) One (1) member who:
35 (A) is a licensed real estate salesperson under
36 IC 25-34.1-3-3.1 or a licensed real estate broker under
37 IC 25-34.1-3-4.1; and
38 (B) has been actively engaged in the practice of residential
39 real estate sales in Indiana for at least five (5) years before
40 the member's appointment to the board.
41 (4) One (1) member who represents the general public and is
42 not associated with the real estate business in any way other

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1 than as a consumer.

2 **Sec. 3. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the term of**
 3 **office for each member of the board is three (3) years.**

4 **(b) A member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and**
 5 **qualified.**

6 **(c) If a vacancy occurs on the board, the governor shall appoint**
 7 **an individual to serve the unexpired term of the previous member**
 8 **or until a successor is appointed and qualified.**

9 **(d) A member may not serve on the board for more than six (6)**
 10 **consecutive years.**

11 **Sec. 4. (a) The board shall elect from its membership a**
 12 **chairperson and a vice chairperson. The chairperson and the vice**
 13 **chairperson shall serve in that capacity for one (1) year and until**
 14 **a successor is elected. However, the chairperson and the vice**
 15 **chairperson may not serve in that capacity for more than two (2)**
 16 **consecutive years.**

17 **(b) The chairperson shall preside at all meetings. The vice**
 18 **chairperson shall preside at meetings in the absence of the**
 19 **chairperson and shall perform other duties as the chairperson may**
 20 **direct.**

21 **Sec. 5. The agency shall employ an executive director. The**
 22 **executive director shall:**

23 **(1) provide reasonable notice to the board members of the**
 24 **time and place of each meeting;**

25 **(2) keep a record of all:**

26 **(A) meetings;**

27 **(B) votes taken by the board; and**

28 **(C) other proceedings, transactions, communications,**
 29 **official acts, and records of the board;**

30 **(3) keep a current file of all licenses and licensees; and**

31 **(4) perform any other duties that the board may prescribe.**

32 **Sec. 6. (a) The board shall meet at least two (2) times each**
 33 **calendar year upon the call of the chairperson or the written**
 34 **request of a majority of the members of the board.**

35 **(b) The chairperson shall establish the time and place for each**
 36 **meeting.**

37 **(c) A majority of the current members of the board constitutes**
 38 **a quorum for the purpose of transacting business at a meeting. The**
 39 **board may take action only upon the affirmative vote of a majority**
 40 **of the members appointed to the board.**

41 **Sec. 7. (a) Each member of the board is entitled to the minimum**
 42 **salary per diem as provided by IC 4-10-11-2.1(b).**



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1 (b) Each member of the board is entitled to reimbursement for
2 traveling expenses as provided under IC 4-13-1-4 and other
3 expenses actually incurred in connection with the member's duties,
4 as provided in the state policies and procedures established by the
5 Indiana department of administration and approved by the budget
6 agency.

7 (c) The compensation and expenses of board members and the
8 expenses of the board shall be paid from the home inspectors
9 licensing fund established under IC 25-20.2-6-2.

10 **Sec. 8. The board may:**

- 11 (1) administer and enforce this article;
- 12 (2) adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 and prescribe forms for
13 licenses, applications, and other documents that are necessary
14 or appropriate for the administration and enforcement of this
15 article;
- 16 (3) issue, deny, suspend, and revoke licenses in accordance
17 with this article, which licenses remain the property of the
18 board;
- 19 (4) subject to IC 25-1-7, investigate complaints concerning
20 licensees or persons the board has reason to believe should be
21 licensees, including complaints respecting failure to comply
22 with this article or the rules, and, when appropriate, take
23 action under IC 25-20.2-4;
- 24 (5) bring actions in the name of the state of Indiana in an
25 appropriate circuit court to enforce compliance with this
26 article or the rules adopted under this article;
- 27 (6) inspect the records of a licensee in accordance with the
28 rules and standards prescribed by the board;
- 29 (7) conduct, or designate a member or other representative to
30 conduct, public hearings on any matter for which a hearing is
31 required under this article and exercise all powers granted
32 under IC 4-21.5;
- 33 (8) adopt a seal containing the words "Indiana Home
34 Inspectors Licensing Board" and, through its executive
35 director, certify copies and authenticate all acts of the board;
- 36 (9) use counsel, consultants, and other persons who are
37 necessary or appropriate to administer and enforce this
38 article and the rules adopted under this article;
- 39 (10) enter into contracts and authorize expenditures that are
40 necessary or appropriate, subject to IC 25-1-6, to administer
41 and enforce this article and the rules;
- 42 (11) maintain the board's office, files, records, and property

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1 in the city of Indianapolis;

2 (12) establish continuing education requirements of not more
3 than twenty (20) hours per year for licensed home inspectors;

4 (13) grant, deny, suspend, and revoke approval of
5 examinations and courses of study;

6 (14) adopt rules to establish, prescribe, or change fees for
7 licenses, renewal licenses, examinations, sanctions, penalties,
8 or other services provided under this article;

9 (15) issue probationary licenses under terms and conditions
10 the board considers necessary to ensure compliance with this
11 article and the rules and standards established by the board;

12 (16) establish standards for licensed home inspectors who
13 serve as supervisors for licensed associate home inspectors
14 under IC 25-20.2-3-4(e); and

15 (17) exercise other specific powers conferred on the board by
16 this article.

17 **Sec. 9. The board shall adopt rules establishing:**

18 (1) standards for the competent practice of home inspections;

19 (2) a code of ethics for licensed home inspectors and licensed
20 associate home inspectors; and

21 (3) report writing standards for licensed home inspectors and
22 licensed associate home inspectors.

23 **Sec. 10. All funds collected under this article shall, at the end of**
24 **each month, be reported to the auditor of state and deposited with**
25 **the treasurer of state for deposit in the home inspectors licensing**
26 **fund established under IC 25-20.2-6-2. All expenses incurred in the**
27 **administration of this article shall be paid from the home**
28 **inspectors licensing fund.**

29 **Chapter 3. Licensing**

30 **Sec. 1. An agency or political subdivision of the state (other than**
31 **the board) may not impose a registration or license requirement or**
32 **a license or an employment fee or charge on licensees for activities**
33 **defined in this article.**

34 **Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), a person may**
35 **not conduct a home inspection for compensation in Indiana**
36 **without a license as a home inspector or an associate home**
37 **inspector.**

38 **(b) This article does not apply to:**

39 (1) a person who is employed as a code enforcement official by
40 the state or a political subdivision and who acts within the
41 scope of the person's employment;

42 (2) a person who is:

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- 1 (A) registered as an architect under IC 25-4-1;
 2 (B) registered as a professional engineer under IC 25-31;
 3 or
 4 (C) licensed as a plumbing contractor or journeyman
 5 plumber under IC 25-28.5;
 6 and who acts within the scope of the person's registration or
 7 license;
 8 (3) a person who is licensed under IC 25-34.1 as a real estate
 9 broker, broker-salesperson, or salesperson and who acts
 10 within the scope of the person's license;
 11 (4) a person who is:
 12 (A) licensed as a real estate appraiser; or
 13 (B) certified as a general or residential real estate
 14 appraiser;
 15 under IC 25-34.1 and who acts within the scope of the
 16 person's license or certificate;
 17 (5) a person who is regulated by the state as an insurance
 18 adjuster and who acts within the scope of the person's
 19 profession;
 20 (6) a person who is certified or registered as a pesticide
 21 applicator or a wood destroying pest inspector and who acts
 22 within the scope of the practice for which the person is
 23 certified or registered;
 24 (7) a person who makes home inspections under the
 25 supervision of a licensed home inspector to meet the
 26 requirements of this article for licensure as a home inspector
 27 or an associate home inspector; or
 28 (8) a tradesperson or home builder who holds a license from
 29 a political subdivision and who acts within the scope of the
 30 person's license.
- 31 **Sec. 3. (a) To obtain a home inspector license, an individual**
 32 **must:**
 33 (1) be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
 34 (2) have graduated from high school or earned a state of
 35 Indiana general educational development (GED) diploma;
 36 (3) not have a conviction for:
 37 (A) an act that would constitute a ground for disciplinary
 38 sanction under IC 25-1-11; or
 39 (B) a crime that has a direct bearing on the individual's
 40 ability to practice competently;
 41 (4) not be listed on a national or state registry of sex
 42 offenders;



- 1 (5) pay the fee established by the board;
- 2 (6) pass a written examination prepared and administered by
- 3 the board or its duly appointed agent;
- 4 (7) secure, maintain, and file with the board a certificate of
- 5 insurance that:
 - 6 (A) provides for general liability coverage in an amount of
 - 7 not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000);
 - 8 (B) lists the state as an additional insured; and
 - 9 (C) is backed by a policy stating that cancellation and
 - 10 nonrenewal of the policy is not effective unless at least ten
 - 11 (10) days notice of the cancellation or nonrenewal has been
 - 12 received in writing by the board;
 - 13 (8) have performed at least two hundred fifty (250) home
 - 14 inspections that were verified by the board and found to be in
 - 15 compliance with the home inspection standards established by
 - 16 the board; and
 - 17 (9) have been licensed as an associate home inspector for not
 - 18 less than one (1) year.
- 19 (b) A license issued under subsection (a) expires two (2) years
- 20 from the date of issuance of the license.
- 21 (c) A licensed home inspector may renew a license upon:
 - 22 (1) paying the renewal fee established by the board; and
 - 23 (2) completing the continuing education requirements
 - 24 established by the board.
- 25 **Sec 4. (a) To obtain an associate home inspector license, an**
- 26 **individual must:**
 - 27 (1) meet the requirements for licensure under section 3(a)(1)
 - 28 through 3(a)(7) of this chapter;
 - 29 (2) become associated with a licensed home inspector who will
 - 30 supervise the home inspections required under section 3(a)(8)
 - 31 of this chapter for a home inspector license; and
 - 32 (3) have completed a board approved training program or
 - 33 course of study and successfully passed an exit examination.
- 34 (b) An associate home inspector license expires one (1) year
- 35 after the date of issuance of the license.
- 36 (c) A licensed associate home inspector may renew an associate
- 37 home inspector license upon:
 - 38 (1) paying the renewal fee established by the board; and
 - 39 (2) completing the continuing education requirements
 - 40 established by the board.
- 41 (d) A person may not hold an associate home inspector license
- 42 for more than five (5) years. If after holding an associate home

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1 inspector license for five (5) years, a licensed associate home
 2 inspector has not met all the requirements to become a licensed
 3 home inspector, the person's associate home inspector license
 4 expires. A person whose associate home inspector license has
 5 expired under this subsection may reapply for a new associate
 6 home inspector license under subsection (a).

7 (e) To meet the requirement in section 3(a)(8) of this chapter for
 8 licensure as a home inspector, a licensed associate home inspector
 9 must perform two hundred fifty (250) home inspections under the
 10 supervision of one (1) or more board approved licensed home
 11 inspectors under the following conditions:

12 (1) The licensed home inspector shall attend and supervise at
 13 least ten (10) home inspections performed by the licensed
 14 associate home inspector, at intervals determined by the
 15 board, and provide comments and guidance to ensure the
 16 licensed associate home inspector's compliance with the
 17 standards of practice, code of ethics, and report writing
 18 standards established by the board under IC 25-20.2-2-9.

19 (2) The licensed home inspector shall review at least two
 20 hundred forty (240) additional home inspection reports and
 21 provide comments and guidance to ensure the licensed
 22 associate home inspector's compliance with the standards of
 23 practice, code of ethics, and report writing standards
 24 established by the board under IC 25-20.2-2-9.

25 (3) The licensed associate home inspector and the licensed
 26 home inspector shall maintain separate logs of all supervised
 27 home inspections. The log must contain at least the following
 28 information:

- 29 (A) the client's name and address;
- 30 (B) the address of the inspected property;
- 31 (C) the date of the inspection;
- 32 (D) the date the written report was reviewed by the
 33 licensed home inspector; and
- 34 (E) any appropriate comments.

35 (4) The supervising licensed home inspector may establish,
 36 with board approval, additional and appropriate training to
 37 advance the skills of the licensed associate home inspector.

38 (5) The supervising licensed home inspector may charge a fee
 39 for the person's service as a supervising inspector.

40 **Sec. 5. (a)** A resident of another state who substantially meets
 41 the requirements of this article may be licensed as a home
 42 inspector in Indiana.



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- 1 **(b) A nonresident home inspector described in subsection (a)**
- 2 **shall file with the board a written consent stating that:**
- 3 **(1) an action arising from the conduct of the licensee's**
- 4 **business in Indiana may be commenced in the county in**
- 5 **Indiana in which the cause of action accrues;**
- 6 **(2) service of process may be made upon the board as agent**
- 7 **for the nonresident licensee; and**
- 8 **(3) service of process in accordance with the Indiana Rules of**
- 9 **Trial Procedure subjects the licensee to the jurisdiction of the**
- 10 **courts in the county in which the cause of action accrues.**

11 **Sec. 6. A licensee shall notify the board immediately of any**
 12 **change of:**

- 13 **(1) name;**
- 14 **(2) name under which the licensee conducts business; or**
- 15 **(3) business address.**

16 **Chapter 4. Enforcement**

17 **Sec. 1. (a) The board may discipline or impose sanctions on a**
 18 **licensee for any of the following violations:**

- 19 **(1) Disclosing information concerning the results of a home**
- 20 **inspection without the approval of a client or the client's legal**
- 21 **representative, except under a court order.**
- 22 **(2) Accepting compensation for the same service from more**
- 23 **than one (1) interested party without the consent of all**
- 24 **interested parties.**
- 25 **(3) Accepting commissions or allowances, directly or**
- 26 **indirectly, from other parties dealing with the licensee's client**
- 27 **in connection with work for which the licensee is responsible.**
- 28 **(4) Failing to disclose to a client information about a business**
- 29 **interest of the licensee that may affect the client in connection**
- 30 **with the home inspection.**
- 31 **(5) Knowingly making a false representation about the**
- 32 **condition of the premises covered by an inspection or about**
- 33 **the extent of the services to be performed.**
- 34 **(6) Committing a felony in the course of the practice of home**
- 35 **inspection or committing any act constituting a violation of**
- 36 **IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(3) or IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(4).**
- 37 **(7) Violating this article or the rules adopted by the board**
- 38 **under this article.**
- 39 **(8) Making a false or misleading representation:**
- 40 **(A) upon an application under this article; or**
- 41 **(B) in providing information requested by the board.**
- 42 **(9) Failing to pay required fees or fines or to maintain the**

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- insurance required under this article.
- (10) Communicating false or misleading advertising about the type of license held.
- (11) Engaging in a course of lewd or immoral conduct in connection with the delivery of services to clients.
- (12) Failing to complete the continuing education requirements established by the board.

(b) The board may impose any of the following sanctions, singly or in combination, if the board finds that a licensee commits a violation described in subsection (a):

- (1) Permanently revoke a licensee's license.
- (2) Suspend a licensee's license.
- (3) Censure a licensee.
- (4) Issue a letter of reprimand.
- (5) Place a licensee on probation and require the licensee to:
 - (A) report regularly to the board upon the matters that are the basis of the probation; or
 - (B) continue or renew professional education under the supervision of another licensee approved by the board until a satisfactory degree of skill is attained in those areas that are the basis of the probation.
- (6) Assess an administrative fine, not to exceed the costs of investigation and enforcement.

Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the board may not impose disciplinary sanctions against a licensee until the board provides the following:

- (1) Notice of the nature of the charges and allegations that constitute a basis for discipline.
- (2) The opportunity for a hearing before the board and notice of the date and time of a hearing before the board.

(b) The board may summarily suspend a license for up to ninety (90) days before a final adjudication or during an appeal of the board's determination if the board finds that the licensee represents a clear and immediate danger to the public's health, safety, or property if the licensee is allowed to continue to practice. The summary suspension may be renewed, upon a hearing before the board, for up to ninety (90) days.

Sec. 3. (a) A person who performs home inspections for compensation without a license under this article as either a home inspector or an associate home inspector commits a Class B infraction. When entering a judgment for an infraction under this section, the court shall add to any penalty imposed the amount of

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1 any fee or other compensation earned in the commission of the
2 infraction. Each transaction constitutes a separate infraction.

3 (b) In all actions for the collection of a fee or other
4 compensation for performing home inspections, the party seeking
5 relief must allege and prove that, at the time the cause of action
6 arose, the party seeking relief was not in violation of this section.

7 (c) The requirements of this section may be waived for
8 individuals moving to Indiana from another jurisdiction if the
9 following requirements are met:

10 (1) The other jurisdiction grants the same privileges to
11 licensees of Indiana.

12 (2) The individual is licensed in the other jurisdiction.

13 (3) The licensing requirements of the other jurisdiction are
14 substantially similar to the requirements of this article.

15 (4) The applicant states that the applicant has studied, is
16 familiar with, and will abide by this article and the rules
17 adopted by the board under this article.

18 Chapter 5. Liability and Immunity From Liability

19 Sec. 1. (a) An action for damages, whether brought in contract
20 or tort or on any other basis, based upon professional services that
21 were rendered or that should have been rendered by a licensed
22 home inspector or a licensed associate home inspector may not be
23 brought, commenced, or maintained in a court in Indiana unless
24 the action is filed not later than two (2) years after the date of the
25 alleged act or omission.

26 (b) A licensed home inspector or a licensed associate home
27 inspector is not liable to a person for damages that arise from an
28 act or omission relating to a home inspection if that person is not
29 a party to the contract under which the home inspection is
30 conducted.

31 (c) A person who:

32 (1) is a professional licensed in Indiana;

33 (2) acts within the scope of the person's profession; and

34 (3) is not a licensed home inspector or a licensed associate
35 home inspector;

36 is not liable for the findings, errors, or omissions of a home
37 inspection unless the person has fraudulently provided or
38 concealed information that induced a licensed home inspector's or
39 a licensed associate home inspector's finding, error, or omission
40 that is the basis of the claim.

41 (d) A person who in good faith recommends or endorses a
42 licensed home inspector or a licensed associate home inspector



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1 without compensation, remuneration, rebate, or other form of
 2 consideration is not liable for the actions of the licensed home
 3 inspector or licensed associate home inspector, including errors,
 4 omissions, the failure to perform contracted duties of a home
 5 inspection, or the failure to meet the standards of practice, report
 6 writing standards, or code of ethics established by the board under
 7 IC 25-20.2-2-9.

8 **Sec. 2. A licensed home inspector, acting as a supervisor of:**

9 (1) a licensed associate home inspector under
 10 IC 25-20.2-3-4(e); or

11 (2) a licensed home inspector or licensed associate home
 12 inspector placed on probation under IC 25-20.2-4-1(b);

13 without charging a fee, is not liable to any person for damages that
 14 arise from an act or omission relating to a home inspection
 15 performed by a licensed associate home inspector or by a licensed
 16 home inspector or licensed associate home inspector placed on
 17 probation.

18 **Chapter 6. Home Inspectors Licensing Fund**

19 **Sec. 1.** As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the home
 20 inspectors licensing fund established in section 2 of this chapter.

21 **Sec. 2. (a)** The home inspectors licensing fund is established for
 22 the purpose of paying the costs of administering this article. The
 23 fund consists of fees and fines remitted by licensees or applicants
 24 under this article and any amounts appropriated to the fund by the
 25 general assembly. The fund shall be administered by the board.

26 (b) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
 27 money in the fund.

28 (c) The board shall invest the money in the fund not currently
 29 needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same manner as
 30 other public money may be invested. Interest that accrues from
 31 these investments shall be deposited in the fund.

32 (d) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not
 33 revert to the state general fund.

34 SECTION 7. IC 34-30-2-98.8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA

38 SECTION 8. [EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2001] (a) As used in this
 39 SECTION, "board" refers to the Indiana home inspectors licensing
 40 board established by IC 25-20.2-2-1, as added by this act.

41 (b) Notwithstanding IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(9), as added by this act,
 42 before December 31, 2001, the board may issue to an individual,

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1 upon the individual's application and payment of fees, a home
2 inspector license if the individual:

3 (1) meets the requirements of IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(1) through
4 IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(7), as added by this act;

5 (2) has been engaged in the practice of home inspections for
6 not less than six (6) months; and

7 (3) has performed at least two hundred fifty (250) home
8 inspections in Indiana.

9 (c) The board may consider and accept the successful
10 completion of equivalent licensing requirements in another state
11 instead of one (1) or more of the requirements of
12 IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(1) through IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(8), as added by this
13 act.

14 (d) This SECTION expires December 31, 2001.

15 SECTION 9. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000] (a) As used in this
16 SECTION, "board" refers to the Indiana home inspectors licensing
17 board established by IC 25-20.2-2-1, as added by this act.

18 (b) Notwithstanding IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(9), as added by this act,
19 an individual may be appointed to the board under
20 IC 25-20.2-2-2(1), as added by this act, if the individual:

21 (1) meets the requirements of IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(1) through
22 IC 25-20.2-3-3(a)(7), as added by this act;

23 (2) has been engaged in the practice of home inspections for
24 not less than six (6) months; and

25 (3) has performed at least two hundred fifty (250) home
26 inspections in Indiana.

27 (c) Before January 1, 2001, the governor shall make the
28 appointments required by this act. Notwithstanding
29 IC 25-20.2-2-3(a), as added by this act, the initial appointments to
30 the board made under IC 25-20.2-2-2, as added by this act, must be
31 staggered so that:

32 (1) three (3) of the initial appointments are for three (3) years;

33 (2) two (2) of the initial appointments are for two (2) years;
34 and

35 (3) two (2) of the initial appointments are for one (1) year.

36 (d) This SECTION expires December 31, 2004.

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
