**Summary of Legislation:** This bill extends for three years the expiration of the Board for the Coordination of Child Care Regulation. The bill allows the Board to meet at any time during the calendar year. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the Board for the Coordination of Child Care Regulation.)

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2001.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** The extension of the authorization for the Board for the Coordination of Child Care Regulation for three years would have an estimated cost of \$55,500 in state General Funds; \$37,000 in the 2002-2003 biennium. The Legislative Council allocates \$18,500 annually for each interim study committee comprised of more than 16 members.
