

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 214

DIGEST OF SB 214 (Updated February 20, 2002 1:24 PM - DI 106)

Citations Affected: IC 35-45; noncode.

Synopsis: Interference with emergency communication. Provides that a person who interferes with or prevents another individual from making a 911 telephone call, obtaining medical treatment, or making a report to a law enforcement officer commits interference with the reporting of a crime, a class A misdemeanor.

Effective: July 1, 2002.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 214

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 35-45-2-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2002]: Sec. 5. A person who, with the intent to commit, conceal
4	or aid in the commission of a crime, knowingly or intentionally
5	interferes with or prevents an individual from:
6	(1) using a 911 emergency telephone system;
7	(2) abtaining madical againtaneas an

- (2) obtaining medical assistance; or
- (3) making a report to a law enforcement officer; commits interference with the reporting of a crime, a Class A misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2002] IC 35-45-2-5, as added by this act, applies only to acts committed after June 30, 2002.
