

# SENATE BILL No. 82

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 4-32-9.

**Synopsis:** Charitable gaming. Permits a bona fide veterans organization to pay operators and workers at the organization's charity gaming events and to hire nonmembers as workers at the events.

**Effective:** July 1, 2002.

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## SENATE BILL No. 82



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 4-32-9-25 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
- 2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2002]: Sec. 25. (a) **This section**
- 3 **does not apply to an allowable event conducted by a qualified**
- 4 **organization that is a bona fide veterans organization (as defined**
- 5 **in IC 4-32-6-10).**
- 6 (b) Except as provided in subsection ~~(b)~~; (c), an operator or a
- 7 worker may not receive remuneration for:
- 8 (1) preparing for;
- 9 (2) conducting;
- 10 (3) assisting in conducting;
- 11 (4) cleaning up after; or
- 12 (5) taking any other action in connection with;
- 13 an allowable event.
- 14 ~~(b)~~ (c) A qualified organization that conducts an allowable event
- 15 may:
- 16 (1) provide meals for the operators and workers during the
- 17 allowable event; and



1           (2) provide recognition dinners and social events for the operators  
2           and workers;  
3           if the value of the meals and social events does not constitute a  
4           significant inducement to participate in the conduct of the allowable  
5           event.  
6           SECTION 2. IC 4-32-9-29 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
7           FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2002]: Sec. 29. **(a) This section**  
8           **does not apply to an allowable event conducted by a qualified**  
9           **organization that is a bona fide veterans organization (as defined**  
10          **in IC 4-32-6-10).**  
11          **(b)** A worker must be a member in good standing of a qualified  
12          organization that is conducting an allowable event for at least thirty  
13          (30) days at the time of the allowable event.

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
