
SENATE BILL No. 395

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 33-13-10.1-15.

Synopsis: COLA for judges' pensions. Requires the benefits payable to participants, survivors, and beneficiaries under the 1985 benefit system of the judges' retirement fund to be increased by the same percentages and under the same conditions as benefits are increased for members of the public employees' retirement fund (PERF).

Effective: July 1, 2002.

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SENATE BILL No. 395

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning pensions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 33-13-10.1-15 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2002]: **Sec. 15. Subject to section 13 of this**
4 **chapter, the monthly benefit payable under this chapter after June**
5 **30, 2002, to participants, survivors, and beneficiaries shall be**
6 **increased by the same percentages and under the same conditions**
7 **as monthly benefits are increased under IC 5-10.2-5 for members**
8 **of the public employees' retirement fund and their survivors and**
9 **beneficiaries.**
