A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION memorializing Jeanette Knoll Adams.

*Whereas, The death of Jeanette Knoll Adams left an enormous void in the lives of everyone she touched;*

*Whereas, Jeanette Knoll Adams was born on December 23, 1940, in Quakertown, Pennsylvania, and passed away on November 26, 2002, in Indianapolis, Indiana;*

*Whereas, Jeanette is survived by her husband James Adams, her daughter Joyce, her mother Florence Knoll, and brothers John and James Knoll;*

*Whereas, Nette, as she was known by her friends and family, served the citizens of Indiana for 39 years as an employee of the Budget Agency and the Legislative Services Agency;*

*Whereas, Nette began her governmental career as a Ford Fellow in the Budget Agency and then served as a fiscal analyst and an attorney for the Legislative Services Agency (LSA);*

*Whereas, During her time at the LSA, Nette dealt with a wide variety of topics ranging from the Administrative Building Council to education and natural resources;*

*Whereas, Everyone who came in contact with Nette appreciated her dedication to duty and her deep concern for*



*the people she worked with;*

*Whereas, In addition to her work at the State House, Nette was a stamp enthusiast who belonged to the American Philatelic Society and the Indiana Stamp Club;*

*Whereas, Nette was an avid supporter of the activities of the 4-H and Girl Scouts, which she enjoyed with her daughter Joyce;*

*Whereas, Each spring Nette could be seen delivering the 4-H geraniums to the State House that she and her daughter, Joyce, had sold;*

*Whereas, Governor Frank O'Bannon awarded Jeanette Knoll Adams a Sagamore of the Wabash, the highest honor the Governor can bestow on a citizen of the state of Indiana; and*

*Whereas, Jeanette Knoll Adams touched the lives of many people and made them better because of it: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives  
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,  
the Senate concurring:*
