**IMPACT:** State

**Summary of Legislation:** This bill requires the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) to design a new license plate for antique motor vehicles. It authorizes a person who registers an antique motor vehicle to display a model year license plate on the antique motor vehicle in certain circumstances.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2005.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** The potential expenditures associated with this proposal will depend upon the type of design and whether or not it is a multi-colored flat plate.

PEN Products (Prison Enterprises Network), the manufacturing and sales arm of prison-made products, charges the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) and other groups petitioning for the creation of a new license plate(s). These charges consist of:

- (1) \$3.80 per plate (flat plate).
- (2) \$4.50 per multi-colored flat plate.
- (3) \$450 one-time set-up. This includes plate set-up by PEN graphic designer.
- (4) PEN Products can prepare the camera artwork for the newly created plate at an hourly rate of \$45.

The funds affected are the PEN Products Revolving Fund and the Motor Vehicle Highway Account, which supports the BMV.

*Background Information:* Over the last five calendar years, the BMV has registered, on average, 7,814 antique motor vehicles. An antique motor vehicle is a vehicle which is 25 years old or older. In addition, the newly

created license plate may be used only while the antique motor vehicle is participating in a: (1) parade; or (2) procession consisting solely of antique motor vehicles in which the antique motor vehicles are operated on a designated route intended to publicly display the antique motor vehicles.
