Summary of Legislation: This bill requires a local child protection service to provide identification cards to its employees.

Effective Date: July 1, 2005.

Explanation of State Expenditures: This bill requires that all state child protective service employees be provided with an identification card that includes the employee's name, that the employee is an agent for a local child protection service, the address and telephone number of the local child protection service, and a photograph of the employee.

The Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) reports that it possesses the equipment to create a form of identification that includes the required information. The cost is approximately \$0.52 per identification card. FSSA currently employs 970 workers in its local child protection services offices. This cost would be approximately \$500 to create a new identification card for all current employees, and \$0.52 for each subsequent identification card made for new employees.
