<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> (Amended) This bill establishes an interim study committee to study certain public safety and homeland security issues.

Effective Date: (Amended) July 1, 2005.

Explanation of State Expenditures: (Revised) The committee is to operate under the policies governing study committees adopted by the Legislative Council. The specific number of committee members is not specified. Legislative Council resolutions in the past have established budgets for interim study committees in the amount of \$8,000 per interim for committees with fewer than 16 members or \$15,000 for committees with 16 or more members. The committee is to study the following issues:

- (1) Homeland security and public safety.
- (2) Procedures for issuing licenses and permits under IC 9-24.
- (3) Identification cards issued by other jurisdictions, including forms of identification other than passports, that are issued to an individual from a foreign country by:
 - (A) an embassy;
 - (B) a consulate; or
 - (C) another official agent of the foreign country.
- (4) Penalties for business entities that employ individuals without verifying employment eligibility as required by the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (8 U.S.C.1324a).
- (5) Procedures for investigating, apprehending, detaining and transporting individuals who are in the United States without permission of the Immigration and Naturalization Service.
- (6) Any other issue assigned by the Legislative Council.
