Synopsis: Funding of emergency warning systems under the Barrett law. Provides that emergency warning systems may be funded under the county and municipal Barrett Law provisions.

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- (8) Emergency warning systems."**

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
