Summary of Legislation: This bill has the following provisions:

- A. It reduces to five the number of friends and relatives of a convicted person who may be present at an execution, and permits up to eight adult members of the immediate family of the victim to be present at an execution.
- B. It requires the Department of Correction (DOC) to establish a procedure to select the family members who may be present at an execution if more than eight family members of a victim wish to attend or if there is more than one victim, and to establish a support room for the use of family members of a victim and support persons who will not be present at the execution.

Effective Date: July 1, 2006.

Explanation of State Expenditures: Indiana's execution chamber is located in the Indiana State Prison. DOC staff indicate that additional witnesses can be accommodated at minimal cost. While the physical layout of the visitation room in the State Prison can accommodate more people, a temporary partition may need to be installed. In addition, procedures would likely be changed so that witnesses representing the offender and the victim would be escorted separately to the viewing room. The existing staff should be sufficient to control the situation should someone need to be removed.

Currently, 29 offenders are on death row and 17 offenders are in the federal appeals stage. Federal appeals is generally the final stage of review before an execution date is scheduled.
