Summary of Legislation: The bill requires that the members of the governing body of a school corporation be elected. The bill repeals obsolete statutes providing for the option of appointment of members of a governing body, and repeals superseded statutes relating to election of members of a governing body.

Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Explanation of Local Expenditures: *Summary:* The election boards of counties that contain appointed school boards would have to place candidates for school board on the ballot of either primary or general elections. County election authorities should be able to implement this provision within their existing level of resources.
