Summary of Legislation: This bill permits a court to order a: (1) one-year suspension of a driver's license of; or (2) a six-month delay in the issuance of a driver's license to; a minor who violates tobacco laws.

Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Explanation of State Expenditures: For the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), this proposal adds another provision for suspension of a driver's license. In CY 2004, the most recent year for which complete data are available, 240,816 driver's licenses were suspended. The new suspension or withholding of a license will be handled within the current procedures of the BMV. The fund affected is the Motor Vehicle Highway Account, which supports the BMV.
