I move that House Bill 1008 be amended to read as follows:

1                   Page 13, between lines 29 and 30, begin a new paragraph and  
2           insert:  
3                   "SECTION 17. IC 20-20-35 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
4           CODE AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
5           [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007]:  
6                   **Chapter 35. Full-Day Kindergarten Block Grant**  
7                   **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "baseline funding" refers to**  
8           **the amount from sources other than a block grant that was**  
9           **expended in the school year immediately preceding the school year**  
10           **in which a school corporation or charter school applies for a block**  
11           **grant for a program covered by a block grant application. The**  
12           **term does not include the amount expended in the immediately**  
13           **preceding school year from a gift or state or federal grant that is**  
14           **not available for funding programs in the calendar year in which**  
15           **the application is made unless the donor or grantor has provided**  
16           **an equivalent source of funding from another source.**  
17                   **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "block grant" refers to a**  
18           **grant under this chapter.**  
19                   **Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "program" refers to a**  
20           **program or activity described in section 4 of this chapter.**  
21                   **Sec. 4. Subject to this chapter, in addition to other**  
22           **distributions to school corporations and charter schools, school**  
23           **corporations and charter schools are eligible to receive a block**  
24           **grant for expansion or enhancement of any combination of the**

1 following:

- 2 (1) Alternative education.  
 3 (2) Optional full-day kindergarten.  
 4 (3) Summer school programs.  
 5 (4) Remediation.  
 6 (5) Reading improvement.  
 7 (6) Gifted and talented programs.  
 8 (7) Professional development.  
 9 (8) Technology.  
 10 (9) Textbooks.

11 **Sec. 5.** To qualify for a block grant, a school corporation or  
 12 charter school must apply to the department for a block grant in  
 13 the form and in the manner prescribed by the department. The  
 14 application must be received by the department before October 1  
 15 in the school year in which the block grant will be used.

16 **Sec. 6.** An application for a block grant must include the  
 17 following:

- 18 (1) A description of each program that will be  
 19 enhanced or expanded with the block grant.  
 20 (2) A statement of the baseline funding level being  
 21 provided for each program covered by the  
 22 application.

23 **Sec. 7.** The department shall review grant applications and  
 24 approve an application only if the grant would expand or enhance  
 25 programs and would not replace baseline funding available to the  
 26 school corporation or charter school for programs.

27 **Sec. 8. (a)** For the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, the  
 28 maximum block grant that the department may award for a school  
 29 year to a school corporation or charter school that will not use the  
 30 entire block grant for expenditures directly related to providing  
 31 optional full-day kindergarten is an amount equal to:

- 32 (1) one thousand five hundred fifty dollars  
 33 (\$1,550); multiplied by  
 34 (2) the school corporation's or charter school's  
 35 ADM for grade 1.

36 **(b)** For the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the  
 37 maximum block grant that the department may award for a school  
 38 year to a school corporation or charter school that will not use the  
 39 entire block grant for expenditures directly related to providing  
 40 optional full-day kindergarten is an amount equal to:

- 41 (1) two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200);  
 42 multiplied by  
 43 (2) the school corporation's or charter school's  
 44 ADM for grade 1.

45 **Sec. 9. (a)** For the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, the  
 46 maximum block grant that the department may award for a school  
 47 year to a school corporation or charter school that will use the

1 entire block grant for expenditures directly related to providing  
2 optional full-day kindergarten is the sum of the following:

3 (1) An amount equal to:

4 (A) one thousand five hundred fifty dollars  
5 (\$1,550); multiplied by

6 (B) the school corporation's or charter  
7 school's ADM for grade 1.

8 (2) An amount equal to:

9 (A) one thousand five hundred fifty dollars  
10 (\$1,550) multiplied by

11 (B) the number of students in the school  
12 corporation or charter school who:

13 (i) are included in the school  
14 corporation's or charter school's  
15 ADM for grade 1; and

16 (ii) qualify for free or reduced  
17 price lunch.

18 (b) For the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the  
19 maximum block grant that the department may award for a school  
20 year to a school corporation or charter school that will use the  
21 entire block grant for expenditures directly related to providing  
22 optional full-day kindergarten is the sum of the following:

23 (1) An amount equal to:

24 (A) two thousand two hundred dollars  
25 (\$2,200); multiplied by

26 (B) the school corporation's or charter  
27 school's ADM for grade 1.

28 (2) An amount equal to:

29 (A) two thousand two hundred dollars  
30 (\$2,200); multiplied by

31 (B) the number of students in the school  
32 corporation or charter school who:

33 (i) are included in the school  
34 corporation's or charter school's  
35 ADM for grade 1; and

36 (ii) qualify for free or reduced  
37 price lunch.

38 **Sec. 10. This chapter expires June 30, 2009."**

39 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
