Synopsis: Highway modernization projects. Requires the department of transportation to add to its biennial work program a category of projects that are designed to improve the capacity of state highways without constructing new travel lanes.

HOUSE BILL No. 1117

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning utilities and transportation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 8-23-12-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.4-2005,
2 SECTION 118, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007]: Sec. 4. (a) The department shall
4 annually adopt from its long range program and publish a biennial
5 work program of construction to be accomplished within the following
6 two (2) fiscal years. This biennial work program must consist of a list
7 of projects listed in order of urgency. In case of emergencies and
8 disasters resulting in the necessity for completely unforeseen demands
9 for construction, or if unforeseen difficulties arise in the acquisition of
10 rights-of-way, materials, labor, or equipment necessary for proposed
11 construction or the availability of funds, a deviation from the adopted
12 biennial work program is permitted. The relative urgency of proposed
13 construction shall be determined by a consideration of the physical
14 condition, the safety and service characteristics of the highways under
15 consideration, and the economic needs of the area served by the
16 highways. In arriving at and making a determination, the department
17 shall utilize all studies, data, and information made available to it from

1 any appropriate source including economic data, relative to affected
2 areas, from the Indiana economic development corporation.
3 **(b) A biennial work program adopted under subsection (a) must**
4 **include a list of projects that are to be accomplished within the**
5 **following two (2) fiscal years and are devoted to the modernization**
6 **of the state's highways. The list required by this subsection may**
7 **include any construction project that is intended to increase the**
8 **capacity of a state highway and that does not include the**
9 **construction of new travel lanes. The list may include a project:**
10 **(1) for the construction of turn lanes;**
11 **(2) to eliminate dangerous curves;**
12 **(3) to eliminate dangerous hill crests; or**
13 **(4) for any other improvement to a state highway that will**
14 **increase the capacity of the state highway without adding new**
15 **travel lanes.**
