SENATE BILL No. 450

DIGEST OF SB 450 (Updated February 20, 2007 2:17 pm - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 12-23; noncode.

Synopsis: Opioid treatment program moratorium and report. Places a moratorium on new opioid treatment programs. Requires the division of mental health and addiction to: (1) compare other state regulations of methadone clinics with Indiana regulations; (2) address concerns that have been raised concerning Indiana's regulation of methadone clinics; and (3) prepare a report to be submitted to the health finance commission and the general assembly; before July 1, 2007. Requires the director of the division of mental health and addiction to testify before the health finance commission, and requires the health finance commission to study the adequacy of Indiana's methadone clinic regulations during the 2007 interim. Repeals a provision that allows new methadone providers under certain circumstances.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 12-23-18-5.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007]: **Sec. 5.5. The division may not grant**
4 **specific approval to be a new opioid treatment program. This**
5 **section does not apply to applications for new opioid treatment**
6 **programs pending prior to March 1, 2007.**

7 SECTION 2. P.L.25-2006, SECTION 1, IS REPEALED
8 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007].

9 SECTION 3. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) **As used in this**
10 **SECTION, "division" refers to the division of mental health and**
11 **addiction established by IC 12-21-1-1.**

12 (b) **Before July 1, 2007, the division shall do the following:**
13 (1) **Compare other state regulation of methadone clinics with**
14 **Indiana's regulation of methadone clinics.**
15 (2) **Review and address concerns regarding Indiana's**
16 **regulation of methadone clinics that have been raised in**
17 **public meetings and by community advocates.**

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COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Health and Provider Services, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 450, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Delete the title and insert the following:

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 1. IC 12-23-18-5.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007]: **Sec. 5.5. The division may not grant specific approval to be a new provider of any of the following:**

- (1) Methadone.
- (2) Levo-alpha-acetylmethadol.
- (3) Levo-alpha-acetylmethadol.
- (4) Levomethadyl acetate.
- (5) LAAM.
- (6) Buprenorphine.

SECTION 2. P.L.25-2006, SECTION 1, IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007]."

Re-number all SECTIONS consecutively.
