## SENATE BILL No. 290



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning labor and safety.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 22-1-1-10 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2008]: Sec. 10. **(a)** Every employer  
3 and place of employment under the jurisdiction of the department of  
4 labor created by this chapter shall:

- 5 (1) furnish employment that is safe for the employees therein;
- 6 (2) furnish and use safety devices, safeguards, methods, and  
7 processes reasonably adequate to render employment and place  
8 of employment safe; and
- 9 (3) do every other thing reasonably necessary to protect the safety  
10 of the employee.

11 **(b) An employer under the jurisdiction of the department of**  
12 **labor may not provide to an employee a key that is necessary for**  
13 **the performance of the employee's job if the key contains more**  
14 **than six-hundredths of one percent (0.06%) lead.**
