

HOUSE BILL No. 1366

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-35-7.5.

Synopsis: High school IEP diplomas for students with a disability. Allows a student who is a child with a disability to receive a high school individualized education program (IEP) diploma.

Effective: July 1, 2008.

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HOUSE BILL No. 1366



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-35-7.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2008]:

4 **Chapter 7.5. High School Individualized Education Program**
5 **Diploma for Students With Disabilities**

6 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "child with a disability" has the**
7 **meaning set forth in IC 20-35-1-2.**

8 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "high school individualized**
9 **education program diploma" means a certificate of graduation**
10 **that a governing body issues to a student who is a child with a**
11 **disability to certify that the student has successfully achieved the**
12 **educational goals specified in the student's individualized**
13 **education program.**

14 **Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any other law:**
15 **(1) the governing body of a school corporation may; or**
16 **(2) for students attending a nonpublic school, the principal of**
17 **a nonpublic school may;**



1 issue a high school individualized education program diploma to a
2 student who is a child with a disability and who satisfies the
3 requirements of this chapter.

4 Sec. 4. Upon application of a student who is a child with a
5 disability or upon application of the student's parent:

- 6 (1) the governing body of a school corporation may; or
- 7 (2) for students attending a nonpublic school, the principal of
8 a nonpublic school may;

9 award a high school individualized education program diploma to
10 the student at any time after the student has attended school or has
11 received a substantially equivalent education elsewhere for at least
12 twelve (12) years, excluding kindergarten, upon a finding that the
13 student has achieved the educational goals specified in the student's
14 individualized education program. This finding must be based on
15 the recommendation of the student's teacher of record, in
16 consultation with the student's teacher in each of the subject areas
17 in which the student is enrolled.

18 Sec. 5. At the end of the school year in which a student who is a
19 child with a disability becomes twenty-one (21) years of age:

- 20 (1) the governing body of a school corporation may; or
- 21 (2) for students attending a nonpublic school, the principal of
22 a nonpublic school may;

23 award a high school individualized education program diploma to
24 a student who is a child with a disability upon a finding that the
25 student has achieved the educational goals specified in the student's
26 individualized education program. This finding must be based on
27 the recommendation of the student's teacher of record, in
28 consultation with the student's teacher in each of the subject areas
29 in which the student is enrolled.

30 Sec. 6. (a) Before awarding a high school individualized
31 education program diploma under this chapter, the governing
32 body of the school corporation or nonpublic school must adopt
33 written policies and procedures ensuring that students with
34 disabilities are provided appropriate opportunities to earn a high
35 school diploma in accordance with the provisions of IC 20-32-4-1
36 through IC 20-32-4-5.

37 (b) A copy of the school corporation's or nonpublic school's
38 policies and procedures adopted under subsection (a) must be kept
39 on file with the state superintendent.

40 Sec. 7. A high school individualized education program diploma
41 awarded under this chapter must be identical in form to the high
42 school diploma issued by the school corporation or nonpublic

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1 school, except that there must appear on the front side of the high
2 school individualized education program diploma an annotation
3 clearly indicating that the diploma is awarded on the basis of the
4 student's successful achievement of the educational goals specified
5 in the student's individualized education program.

6 Sec. 8. If a student receiving a high school individualized
7 education program diploma under this chapter is less than
8 twenty-one (21) years of age at the time the diploma is awarded,
9 the diploma must be accompanied by a written statement of
10 assurance that the student continues to be eligible to attend the
11 public school where the student has legal settlement without the
12 payment of tuition until:

- 13 (1) the student earns a high school diploma; or
- 14 (2) the end of the school year in which the student becomes
- 15 twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 16 whichever is earlier.

17 Sec. 9. Each superintendent of a school corporation or principal
18 of a nonpublic school must submit to the department, before June
19 15, a report concerning students awarded high school
20 individualized education program diplomas in that school year.
21 The report must be in a form prescribed by the state board and
22 must contain any information the state board requires.

23 Sec. 10. The state board shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to
24 implement this chapter.

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
