IMPACT: State

Summary of Legislation: This bill provides that if an individual is temporarily residing outside Indiana because of service in the armed forces of the United States, the individual's driver's license (which includes any type of license authorizing the operation of a motor vehicle on public streets and highways), despite expiring, remains valid for 90 days following the individual's discharge from service in the armed forces. (Current law similarly provides for a 90-day period of post-discharge validity, but it applies only to an individual's operator's license.) It provides for certain exceptions applying to the operation of certain vehicles during the 90-day period. The bill makes a technical correction.

Effective Date: July 1, 2009.

Explanation of State Expenditures: Whatever expenditures might be associated with this proposal are expected to be minimal. The fund affected is the Motor Vehicle Highway Account, which supports the Bureau of Motor Vehicles.

Background Information: About 6,000 people who are residents of Indiana serving in the armed forces outside of Indiana potentially could be affected by this proposal.
