IMPACT: State

Summary of Legislation: (Amended) This bill exempts the children of a public safety officer who is killed in the line of duty from the payment of tuition and regularly assessed fees for up to eight semesters at a state educational institution or technical school. (Currently, the children must be younger than 23 years of age to use the benefit.)

Effective Date: July 1, 2009.

Explanation of State Expenditures: (Revised) The bill could increase the state cost of tuition remission for the children of public safety officers who are killed in the line of duty. The number of these children who are more than 23 years of age who might apply for the fee remission is unknown. The number is probably small. The bill also limits the exemption to eight semesters or the equivalent. The provision could be a unknown savings.

Background: The following table shows the number and dollar amount of tuition remission for children of public safety officers who are killed in the line of duty.
