Synopsis: Licensure of genetic counselors. Requires the licensure of genetic counselors.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 25-1-2-2.1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.3-2008,
- 2 SECTION 175, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
- 3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2009]: Sec. 2.1. Rather than being issued
- 4 annually, the following permits, licenses, certificates of registration, or
- 5 evidences of authority granted by a state agency must be issued for a
- 6 period of two (2) years or for the period specified in the article under
- 7 which the permit, license, certificate of registration, or evidence of
- 8 authority is issued if the period specified in the article is longer than
- 9 two (2) years:
- 10 (1) Certified public accountants, public accountants, and
- 11 accounting practitioners.
- 12 (2) Architects and landscape architects.
- 13 (3) Dry cleaners.
- 14 (4) Professional engineers.
- 15 (5) Land surveyors.
- 16 (6) Real estate brokers.
- 17 (7) Real estate agents.



- 1 (8) Security dealers' licenses issued by the securities
- 2 commissioner.
- 3 (9) Dental hygienists.
- 4 (10) Dentists.
- 5 (11) Veterinarians.
- 6 (12) Physicians.
- 7 (13) Chiropractors.
- 8 (14) Physical therapists.
- 9 (15) Optometrists.
- 10 (16) Pharmacists and assistants, drugstores or pharmacies.

32 **ARTICLE 17.3. GENETIC COUNSELORS**

33 **Chapter 1. Definitions**

34 **Sec. 1. The definitions in this chapter apply throughout this**
35 **article.**

36 **Sec. 2. "Board" refers to the medical licensing board of Indiana**
37 **created by IC 25-22.5-2-1.**

38 **Sec. 3. "Genetic counseling" means the communication by an**
39 **individual of any of the following:**

- 40 **(1) Estimating, through the following methods, the likelihood**
- 41 **of the occurrence or recurrence of a birth defect or a**
- 42 **potentially inherited or genetically influenced condition:**



- 1 (A) Obtaining and analyzing the health history of an
- 2 individual and the individual's family.
- 3 (B) Reviewing medical records.
- 4 (C) Evaluating the risks of exposure to possible mutagens
- 5 or teratogens.
- 6 (D) Recommending genetic testing or other evaluation to
- 7 detect fetal abnormalities or determine the carrier status
- 8 of a family member.
- 9 (2) Explaining to an individual or a family the following:
- 10 (A) The medical, psychological, and social implications of
- 11 a disorder and the usual course of evaluation, treatment,
- 12 or management.
- 13 (B) The genetic factors that contribute to the disorder and
- 14 how the genetic factors affect the chance for recurrence of
- 15 the condition in other family members.
- 16 (C) The available options for coping with, preventing, or
- 17 reducing the chance of occurrence or recurrence of the
- 18 disorder.
- 19 (D) The genetic or other tests available for inherited
- 20 disorders.
- 21 (E) How to interpret complex genetic test results.
- 22 Sec. 4. "Genetic counselor" means an individual who is licensed
- 23 under this article to provide genetic counseling.
- 24 Sec. 5. "Genetic supervision" refers to the assessment by:
- 25 (1) an individual who is licensed under this article; or
- 26 (2) a physician licensed under IC 25-22.5;
- 27 of an individual who is issued a temporary genetic counselor
- 28 license. The term includes regular meetings and chart review
- 29 under a genetic supervision contract entered into by both parties.
- 30 Chapter 2. Requirements for Licensure as a Genetic Counselor
- 31 Sec. 1. To qualify for licensure as a genetic counselor, an
- 32 applicant must:
- 33 (1) submit an application on a form developed by the board;
- 34 (2) pay the licensure fee determined by the board;
- 35 (3) provide written evidence that the applicant has earned:
- 36 (A) a master's degree from a genetic counseling training
- 37 program accredited by the American Board of Genetic
- 38 Counseling or its successor; or
- 39 (B) a doctoral degree from a medical genetics training
- 40 program that is accredited by the American Board of
- 41 Medical Genetics or its successor; and
- 42 (4) meet the examination requirement for certification as:

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1 (A) a genetic counselor by the American Board of Genetic
 2 Counseling or the American Board of Medical Genetics or
 3 the successor of these entities; or
 4 (B) a medical geneticist by the American Board of Medical
 5 Genetics or its successor.

6 Sec. 2. (a) The board may issue a temporary license to an
 7 applicant who:
 8 (1) meets all the requirements under section 1 of this chapter
 9 except the requirement for examination for certification
 10 under section 1(4) of this chapter; and
 11 (2) has an active candidate status for the certification.

12 (b) An individual who practices under a temporary license
 13 issued under this section must:
 14 (1) be directly supervised by a licensed genetic counselor or a
 15 physician licensed under IC 25-22.5 under a genetic
 16 supervision contract; and
 17 (2) apply for and take the next available examination for
 18 certification.

19 (c) An individual who holds a temporary license issued under
 20 this section and fails the examination for certification described in
 21 section 1(4) of this chapter for the first time may reapply for a
 22 second temporary license. The board may not issue a temporary
 23 license to an individual who has failed the examination for
 24 certification more than one (1) time.

25 (d) A temporary license issued under this section expires upon
 26 the earliest of the following:
 27 (1) The date the individual meets the requirements of this
 28 chapter and is issued a license.
 29 (2) Thirty (30) days after the individual fails the examination
 30 for certification described in section 1(4) of this chapter.
 31 (3) The date printed on the temporary license.

32 (e) An individual who is issued a temporary license under this
 33 section shall inform the board of the results of the individual's
 34 examination for certification described in section 1(4) of this
 35 chapter.

36 Sec. 3. The following individuals are not required to be licensed
 37 under this article:
 38 (1) An individual who is licensed, certified, or registered in
 39 another occupation in which genetic counseling occurs.
 40 However, the individual may not use the title "genetic
 41 counselor" or any other title that indicates that the individual
 42 is a genetic counselor unless the individual is licensed under

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this article.

(2) A student or an intern from an accredited school who is participating in a supervised training program.

(3) An individual from another state who is certified by the American Board of Medical Genetics or the American Board of Genetic Counseling and acting in Indiana on a consultant basis.

Sec. 4. (a) To renew a license under this article, an applicant must complete continuing education. The continuing education must meet the requirements of IC 25-1-4 and consist of:

(1) the completion in each two (2) year license cycle of thirty (30) contact hours that have been approved by the American Board of Genetic Counseling; or

(2) the successful completion in each two (2) year license cycle of a reading assignment and proctored examination in medical genetics by the American Board of Medical Genetics.

(b) An applicant seeking renewal of a license shall certify that the applicant:

(1) has complied with the continuing education requirements;

(2) is exempt from the continuing education requirements; or

(3) has not complied with the continuing education requirements but is seeking a waiver under section 5 of this chapter from the board.

Sec. 5. The board may grant an applicant seeking renewal of a license a waiver from all or part of the continuing education requirement for the renewal period if the applicant was not able to fulfill the requirement due to a hardship that resulted from any of the following conditions:

(1) Service in the armed forces of the United States during a substantial part of the renewal period.

(2) An incapacitating illness or injury.

(3) Other circumstances determined by the board.

Chapter 3. Unlawful Practices

Sec. 1. An individual who does not have a valid license or temporary license as a genetic counselor under this article may not use the title "genetic counselor", "licensed genetic counselor", or any word, letter, abbreviation, or insignia that indicates or implies that the individual has been issued a license or met the qualifications for licensure under this article.

Sec. 2. (a) If the board believes that a person has engaged in or is about to engage in an act or practice that constitutes or will constitute a violation of section 1 of this chapter, the board may

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1 apply to a circuit or superior court for an order enjoining the act
2 or practice.

3 (b) If the board determines that a person has engaged in or is
4 about to engage in an act or practice that constitutes or will
5 constitute a violation of section 1 of this chapter, an injunction, a
6 restraining order, or another appropriate order may be granted by
7 the court.

8 Sec. 3. If the board believes that a person has knowingly or
9 intentionally engaged in an act or practice that violates section 1 of
10 this chapter, the board may bring the information to the attention
11 of the attorney general, and the attorney general may cause
12 criminal proceedings to be brought against the person.

13 Sec. 4. A person who knowingly or intentionally violates section
14 1 of this chapter commits a Class A misdemeanor.

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
