## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 4-32.2.

**Synopsis:** Charitable gaming. Allows a worker at a festival to participate in events that the worker does not personally conduct or help to conduct. Provides that a driver's license number or other identifying information of an operator or worker that is submitted to the gaming commission on an application for a license is confidential.

**Effective:** July 1, 2009.

## HOUSE BILL No. 1664

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning gaming.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 4-32.2-5-14, AS AMENDED BY P.L.95-2008,  
2 SECTION 10, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2009]: Sec. 14. (a) **Except as provided by subsection (c)**, an  
4 operator or a worker may not directly or indirectly participate, other  
5 than in a capacity as an operator or a worker, in an allowable event that  
6 the operator or worker is conducting.  
7 (b) A patron at a charity game night may deal the cards in a card  
8 game if:  
9 (1) the card game in which the patron deals the cards is a game of  
10 euchre;  
11 (2) the patron deals the cards in the manner required in the  
12 ordinary course of the game of euchre; and  
13 (3) the euchre game is played under the supervision of the  
14 qualified organization conducting the charity game night in  
15 accordance with rules adopted by the commission under  
16 IC 4-32.2-3-3.  
17 A patron who deals the cards in a euchre game conducted under this

1 subsection is not considered a worker or an operator for purposes of  
2 this article.

3 **(c) This subsection applies only to a festival event. A worker**  
4 **may participate in any event or gambling game conducted at a**  
5 **festival event held by a qualified organization except for an event**  
6 **or gambling game that the worker personally conducts or helps**  
7 **conduct on behalf of the qualified organization.**

8 SECTION 2. IC 4-32.2-9-9, AS ADDED BY P.L.91-2006,  
9 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
10 JULY 1, 2009]: Sec. 9. **(a)** Information obtained by the commission  
11 during the course of an investigation conducted under this chapter is  
12 confidential.

13 **(b) A driver's license number or other identifying information**  
14 **of an operator or worker that is submitted to the commission on an**  
15 **application for a license under this article is confidential.**
