

SENATE MOTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I move that Engrossed House Bill 1003 be amended to read as follows:

- 1 Page 3, delete line 13.
- 2 Page 3, line 15, delete "IC 20-31-8-3." and insert "**IC 20-31-8-3;**
- 3 **and**".
- 4 Page 3, between lines 15 and 16, begin a new line block indented
- 5 and insert:
- 6 "**(8) complies with the requirements of IC 20-30-5, including**
- 7 **but not limited to the following:**
- 8 (A) **Maintains at least one (1) copy of each of the following**
- 9 **writings or documents:**
- 10 (i) **The Constitution of the United States.**
- 11 (ii) **The national motto.**
- 12 (iii) **The national anthem.**
- 13 (iv) **The Pledge of Allegiance.**
- 14 (v) **The Constitution of the State of Indiana.**
- 15 (vi) **The Declaration of Independence.**
- 16 (vii) **The Mayflower Compact.**
- 17 (vii) **The Federalist Papers.**
- 18 (ix) **"Common Sense" by Thomas Paine.**
- 19 (x) **The writings, speeches, documents, and**
- 20 **proclamations of the founding fathers and presidents of**
- 21 **the United States.**
- 22 (xi) **United States Supreme Court decisions.**
- 23 (xii) **Executive orders of the presidents of the United**
- 24 **States.**
- 25 (xiii) **Frederick Douglas' Speech at Rochester, New York,**
- 26 **on July 5, 1852, entitled "What to a Slave is the Fourth**
- 27 **of July?".**
- 28 (xiv) **David Walker's Appeal.**
- 29 (xv) **Chief Seattle's letter to the United States**

- 1 government in 1852 in response to the United States
 2 government's inquiry regarding the purchase of tribal
 3 lands.
- 4 **(B) Displays the United States flag in each classroom.**
- 5 **(C) Provides a daily opportunity for students to voluntarily**
 6 **recite the Pledge of Allegiance in each classroom or on**
 7 **school grounds. A student is exempt from participation in**
 8 **the Pledge of Allegiance and may not be required to**
 9 **participate in the Pledge of Allegiance if:**
- 10 **(i) the student chooses to not participate; or**
 11 **(ii) the student's parent chooses to have the student not**
 12 **participate.**
- 13 **(D) Provides instruction on the constitutions of:**
- 14 **(i) Indiana; and**
 15 **(ii) the United States.**
- 16 **(E) For a school that enrolls students in grades 6 through**
 17 **12, provides within the two (2) weeks preceding a general**
 18 **election five (5) full recitation periods of class discussion**
 19 **concerning:**
- 20 **(i) the system of government in Indiana and in the United**
 21 **States;**
 22 **(ii) methods of voting;**
 23 **(iii) party structures;**
 24 **(iv) election laws; and**
 25 **(v) the responsibilities of citizen participation in**
 26 **government and in elections.**
- 27 **(F) Requires that each teacher employed by the school**
 28 **present instruction with special emphasis on:**
- 29 **(i) honesty;**
 30 **(ii) morality;**
 31 **(iii) courtesy;**
 32 **(iv) obedience to law;**
 33 **(v) respect for the national flag and the Constitution of**
 34 **the State of Indiana and the Constitution of the United**
 35 **States;**
 36 **(vi) respect for parents and the home;**
 37 **(vii) the dignity and necessity of honest labor; and**
 38 **(viii) other lessons of a steadying influence that tend to**
 39 **promote and develop an upright and desirable citizenry.**
- 40 **(G) Provides good citizenship instruction that stresses the**
 41 **nature and importance of the following:**
- 42 **(i) Being honest and truthful.**
 43 **(ii) Respecting authority.**
 44 **(iii) Respecting the property of others.**
 45 **(iv) Always doing the student's personal best.**
 46 **(v) Not stealing.**
 47 **(vi) Possessing the skills (including methods of conflict**

- 1 resolution) necessary to live peaceably in society and not
 2 resorting to violence to settle disputes.
- 3 (vii) Taking personal responsibility for obligations to
 4 family and community.
- 5 (viii) Taking personal responsibility for earning a
 6 livelihood.
- 7 (ix) Treating others the way the student would want to
 8 be treated.
- 9 (x) Respecting the national flag, the Constitution of the
 10 United States, and the Constitution of the State of
 11 Indiana.
- 12 (xi) Respecting the student's parents and home.
- 13 (xii) Respecting the student's self.
- 14 (xiii) Respecting the rights of others to have their own
 15 views and religious beliefs.
- 16 (9) Provides instruction in the following studies:
- 17 (A) Language arts, including:
- 18 (i) English;
- 19 (ii) grammar;
- 20 (iii) composition;
- 21 (iv) speech; and
- 22 (v) second languages.
- 23 (B) Mathematics.
- 24 (C) Social studies and citizenship, including the:
- 25 (i) constitutions;
- 26 (ii) governmental systems; and
- 27 (iii) histories;
- 28 of Indiana and the United States, including a study of the
 29 Holocaust in each high school United States history
 30 course.
- 31 (D) Sciences.
- 32 (E) Fine arts, including music and art.
- 33 (F) Health education, physical fitness, safety, and the
 34 effects of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, and other substances on
 35 the human body.
- 36 (G) Additional studies selected by each governing body,
 37 subject to revision by the state board.
- 38 (10) Does not provide instruction:
- 39 (A) concerning malevalence or hate based on:
- 40 (i) religion;
- 41 (ii) ethnicity; or
- 42 (iii) sexual orientation; or
- 43 (B) emphasizing discrimination based on gender."
- 44 Page 5, between lines 10 and 11, begin a new paragraph and insert:
 45 "(d) The department shall, at a minimum, annually visit each
 46 eligible school to verify that the eligible school complies with the
 47 provisions of IC 20-51-4, the Constitution of the state of Indiana,

1 **state and federal laws.**
2 **(e) Each eligible school shall grant the department full access to**
3 **its premises including:**
4 **(1) access to any points of ingress to and egress from the**
5 **eligible school's grounds, buildings, and property; and**
6 **(2) access to inspect school records, observe classroom**
7 **instruction, and review any instructional materials."**
