IMPACT: Local

Summary of Legislation: This bill provides that an individual vendor of a farmer's market or roadside stand is not considered to be a food establishment if the individual vendor's food product is made, grown, or raised by an individual at the individual's primary residence, property owned by the individual, or property leased by the individual. (Current law requires the food product to be made in the vendor's primary residence.)

The bill provides that poultry offered for sale at a farmer's market or roadside stand is not a potentially hazardous food product for purposes of exemption from the food establishment laws if the individual vendor of the poultry: (1) complies with certain requirements; (2) does not slaughter poultry that is dying, disabled, or diseased; (3) does not distribute poultry that has died before slaughter; (4) processes the poultry safely; (5) maintains proper temperature control of the poultry; and (6) is exempt from antemortem inspection and postmortem inspection and other requirements by the Board of Animal Health.

The bill exempts a farmer's market or roadside stand vendor from meat inspection requirements if certain food safety requirements are met.
