Whereas, The wrestling team from Perry Meridian High School, Indianapolis, ended another perfect season by winning the 17th annual Indiana High School Athletic Association team wrestling state championship;

Whereas, The Perry Meridian Falcons defeated Crown Point with a 43-14 victory to secure their second consecutive state team title;

Whereas, The Perry Meridian Falcons have also finished as runners-up four times - 1991-92, 2001-02, 2003-04, and 2008-09;

Whereas, Perry Meridian was impressive on the road to victory, as the team advanced to the championship round with a 52-19 quarterfinal victory and a 40-19 semifinals victory;
