**IMPACT:** State

**Summary of Legislation:** This bill prohibits dental insurers and health maintenance organizations (HMOs) from requiring dentists to accept certain payments.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2013.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** This bill provides that dental insurers and HMOs that violate the provisions of the bill commit an unfair and deceptive act. To the extent dental insurers and HMOs are found to have engaged in unfair and deceptive acts, this bill will increase workload of the Department of Insurance to investigate allegations and provide adjudicative proceedings to determine if an unfair or deceptive act has been committed.

**Explanation of State Revenues:** If this bill increases the number of unfair and deceptive acts discovered by the Department of Insurance, revenue to the General Fund will increase from civil penalties paid by violators. The penalty for engaging in an unfair and deceptive act is one or more of the following: (1) a civil penalty between \$25,000 and \$50,000 for each act or violation and (2) revocation of a person's license or certificate of authority if they knowingly engaged in an unfair or deceptive act. Actual increases in revenue are unknown.
