Summary of Legislation: The bill urges the Legislative Council to assign to a study committee during the 2013 legislative interim the topic of the suspension of state elected officials (excluding officials of the judicial branch of state government and prosecuting attorneys) and local elected officials who are charged with the commission of a felony.

Effective Date: July 1, 2013.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The impact of this provision would depend on future Legislative Council action. A topic assigned to an existing statutory committee would likely not increase expenditures. If a new interim committee were established, expenditures would increase. The additional expenditures would be the budgeted amount of resources for the new committee by the Legislative Council. During the FY 2012 interim, the Legislative Council set the budgets for study committees at \$9,500 for committees with less than 16 members and \$16,500 for committees with 16 or more members.
